Mayor's Committee for Employment of Persons with Disabilities

The San Francisco Mayor's Committee is part of a nation-wide structure established in 1947 by the President's Committee under President Harry Truman. Since that time every president has given his personal and active support to the work of these committees.

Just as Governor's Committees at the State level are extensions of the President's Committee, affiliated local committees are extensions at the community level of the State committees.

Local committees have autonomy in selecting a name, goals, objectives and activities. Local committees are made up of people involved in the community so as to decide how best to serve the employment needs of disabled persons in their locale.

What do we do?

- Employer Recognition Breakfast honoring businesses that hire persons with disabilities.
- Annual Career Fair, bringing together employers with several hundred job-seekers with disabilities.
- "Brown-Bag" lunches, presenting information for employers about hiring or accommodating persons with disabilities.
- Fund Raising for scholarships for students with disabilities.
